

Mexico

The main Christmas celebration in Mexico is called Las Posadas. People re-enact Joseph and Mary's search for somewhere to stay in Bethlehem.

A traditional prayer is spoken, and the party begins. Food and drink are served and then children take it in turns to break open the piñata.

Denmark

The Christmas feast in Denmark is usually celebrated at midnight on Christmas Eve.


It is common to have special rice pudding dessert in which a single almond is hidden.

This person will be reading out the questions and making sure nobody cheats!




Select the teams:

True or False: There is a town called Santa Claus?






Santa has nine reindeers. Can you name them all? (Point for each one and a bonus point for all nine)
